



April Historical Notes... by Bob Yarnell

What you read, matters!

What books did colonial people have in their personal libraries? What books could be found in the lending libraries and college libraries? Trevor Colbourn, in Lamp of Experience, writes that the books found in personal and college libraries throughout all the colonies are remarkably similar and history books formed the backbone of these libraries. The people immersed themselves in history. In particular, they all had Germania by Tacitus and many books on recent (since 1600) English history. Most put forth arguments that we now associate with Whig History.

Thomas Jefferson, in his book Notes on Virginia, gives as good a summation of the whig view of history as you'll find. The Anglo-Saxons went to England and set up a society based on private property, free trade and an elected King. The Normans invaded and imposed on England a feudal system, taking away the property and rights of the Saxons. Slowly but surely, they rolled back the Norman system. At Runnymede the English Barons forced King John to sign the Magna Charta. Under pressure for money for his wars, Edward I established Parliament to give towns representation. Following the upheaval of the English Civil War in the mid 1600's, the Glorious Revolution of 1688 established supremacy of Parliament. In other words, Whig history is the view that step-by-step society advances to a better world with ever increasing freedom and liberty triumphing over power.1

This is the view of history presented in the

books in the libraries of colonial America. Thus, this view of history dominated the thinking of the colonial leaders. They saw themselves as the Saxons being put upon by the Normans (King and Parliament) and pushed back to regain their traditional, inherited rights which Parliament was taking from them.

While there are legitimate problems with the Whig view of history, most colonial Americans believed it and, in that belief, they acted. In their mind, they were righting a wrong and establishing a system that would prevent this wrong from ever occurring again.

To put it simply, they believed they had certain inherited, traditional rights. These rights had been and were being infringed upon by the King and Parliament. Just as their forefathers pushed back against King John, King Edward and the Stuarts, they saw a duty to push back against Parliament.

Therefore, it is not a stretch to view the Whig view of history as a powerful animating force in bringing about the break with England.

¹Whig History is different from Whig political theory, although Whig politicians in England in the late 1700's and into the 1800's believed they were the living embodiment of whig history. It also has nothing to do with the Whig political party that formed in the 1830's in the US and lasted until the Civil War.





The Florida Society of the Sons of the American Revolution became aware of this amphibious assault sometime ago, further, it was learned that the only known monument to the event is a small plaque in the Bahamas. Subsequently, it was decided it was appropriate to erect a memorial to commemorate this historic event

Pompano Beach was chosen among other reasons as the closest logical location on the US mainland to the actual landing site in the Bahamas. The location currently receives approximately 280,000 visitors annually

A committee was formed to plan, coordinate, raise funds, and erect a fitting monument. The committee has been engaged in these tasks for several months.






