
Dick Young and Charles Klug (above) and David Byrant (below) were also awarded Certificates of Appreciation from the FLSSAR.


## October & November 2025 Chapter Meeting Speakers

#### **Mark Barie**

Mark Barie is an award-winning author, originally from Upstate New York.

After authoring several local history books, he transitioned to historical romance novels when he moved to Florida, year-round, in 2015.

His first novel, a Civil War love story, was inspired by his wife, Christine. She is an expert genealogist and discovered that Mark's ancestors fought in the Civil War. Mark's ancestors also fought in the American Revolutionary War and the War of 1812. The result was an award-winning trilogy on love and war that has garnered state, national, and international recognition.



Most recently, Mark published a love story involving the mysterious destruction of the USS Maine, which led to the Spanish American War. The novel made headlines for its ground-breaking research into who and what caused the explosion. In September of last year, Barie published the fifth novel in his series on love and war, **"For King, Country, and Love"**, a riveting World War I love story about a nurse and her many patients.

Barie is an accomplished public speaker, making dozens of presentations each year, on America's earliest wars, to historical societies, service organizations, and genealogical groups across the State of Florida.


### **Tom McMillan**

Tom is the author of five books on American history, including *The Year That Made America*, which recounts the intense political battle that led to the Declaration of Independence. He has also written two books on the Battle of Gettysburg and one each on September 11 and the Star-Spangled Banner from Fort McHenry.

He has served on the board of trustees of Pittsburgh's Heinz History Center, on the board of directors of the Friends of Flight 93 National Memorial, on the marketing committee of the Gettysburg Foundation, and as a tour guide at the Civil War room at Carnegie Library. Tom currently serves as co-host of the "Antietam and Beyond" podcast and is a facilitator of the Adams County Historical Society's battlefield leadership program in Gettysburg. He has a journalism degree from Point Park University in Pittsburgh.

## September Historical Notes... by Bob Yarnell

#### The Philadelphia Campaign

August—December 1777, Part 1

Washington and the Continental Army spent the late winter of 1776-1777 camped near Morristown, NJ. Howe's British Army wintered near New Brunswick, NJ. During the spring of 1777 both sides engaged in patrolling and foraging while the respective commanders planned the summer campaign.

Washington watched and waited, not sure if Howe would move north to assist Burgoyne or whether Howe would move on Philadelphia. And, if he moved on Philadelphia, would he go by land and force a crossing of the Delaware River or go by sea, via the Chesapeake Bay and land south of Philadelphia.

In several letters to the Government in London, Howe laid out his plan to capture Philadelphia by moving his army up the Chesapeake. While the authorities in London approved Howe's plan, they held out hope that Howe could accomplish his goal quickly and then be able to send troops north to assist Burgoyne.

From April to July Howe maneuvered in central NJ in the hope of drawing Washington out of his position and forcing a battle that would enable Howe to destroy the Continental Army. Washington refused to take the bait, and in August Howe embarked his army on transports and sailed up the Chesapeake. He landed in Maryland

about 55 miles south of Philadelphia.

When Washington finally had a clear idea of Howe's plan, he moved the Continental Army and placed it in defensive positions along Brandywine Creek. When Howe arrived, he met with several Loyalist sympathizers who informed him that the Americans had left several fords across the creek unguarded.

On Sept. 11, 1777, Howe sent Cornwallis with a strong column to flank the Americans. Cornwallis and his men completed the march and were in position to attack by mid-afternoon. Cornwallis' flank attack forced the Americans to respond by shifting troops from the center of the line to the right. Seeing this, the British made a frontal assault on the now weakened American center.

Although Washington allowed himself to get flanked as he had a year earlier on Long Island, after the initial shock of the flank attack and what looked to be the beginning of a rout, the American right steadied. But with the collapse of the American center, the Continental Army withdrew from the field. It was bloodied and chased from the field, but it was not routed or destroyed.

Next month: the British take Philadelphia and the Battle of Germantown.



(PRS) Monthly Notes

## **Application / Supplemental Formatting Notes ...**

I think I've hit the highlights over the last few newsletters for some formatting tips / tricks / aspects of your applications and supplementals. I will just again refer you to the application handbook for information.

I will also mention that if anyone has any free time and would like to assist in transcribing records into the PRS, please reach out to Jamie Callendar (jamiecallender55@gmail.com) and let him know. It's not difficult, and the training material is really straight-forward. doesn't take long to get the hang of it. While there's not many FL records to do anymore, you can always request (as I did) to go outside the state to assist other states that have literally hundreds of applications and supplementals that need to be transcribed still. All you need is a computer and access to the internet to be able to pull up the records, look at what's typed out on the old record and type it into the blocks of the digital form.

Volunteering in this way can also earn you a SAR Lafayette medal for so many service hours as well, plus it's a great way to assist the SAR in a non-monetary way. At this point in time, I've transcribed over 1600 records, and Bill Leroy—another of our members has done over 1700 records.





#### FLSSAR INVOLVEMENT

The Florida Society of the Sons of the American Revolution became aware of this amphibious assault sometime ago, further, it was learned that the only known monument to the event is a small plaque in the Bahamas. Subsequently, it was decided it was appropriate to erect a memorial to commemorate this historic event

Pompano Beach was chosen among other reasons as the closest logical location on the US mainland to the actual landing site in the Bahamas. The location currently receives approximately 280,000 visitors annually

A committee was formed to plan, coordinate, raise funds, and erect a fitting monument. The committee has been engaged in these tasks for several months.





#### 14 Jan 1897 — 16 Dec 1998 Interred at Dothan City Cemetery, Dothan, AL

William Sidney Wilson II was born on 14 January 1897, in Houston county, Alabama. He married Caroline Wynn on 28 September 1921, in Marianna, FL. They were the parents of 1 daughter. He lived in Dothan, Alabama, He died on 16 Dec 1998, at the age of 101, and was buried in Dothan City Cemetery, Dothan, AL.

Army Air Corps in World War from 1918 to 1919. He then became an active member of the Army Reserves from 1919 to 1924. Wilson was one of five pilots who made the first night formation flight. The flight, from Langley Field to New York and back, was completed with no guidance beam or radar to assist them. The mission would be a prelude to the night bombing so essential to victory in World War II.

Wilson attended the University of Alabama and completed a law degree at the University of Florida. He began practicing in 1925 but always remained involved and interested in aviation-related matters. Wilson received the Hearst Bombing trophy in 1924. He was inducted into the Alabama Aviation Hall of Fame in 1997, sealing his place in military flight history.


